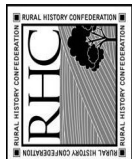

Pennsylvania Turnpike (Route 276).

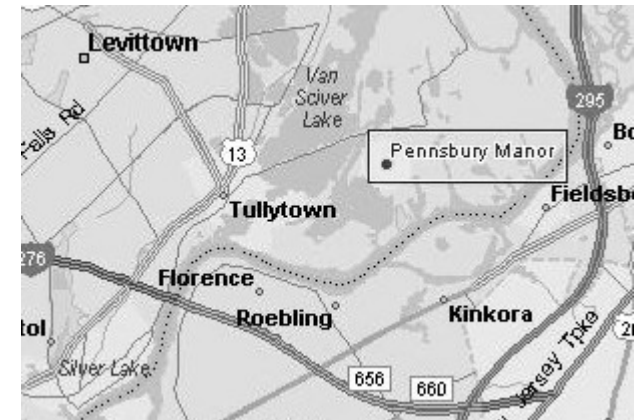

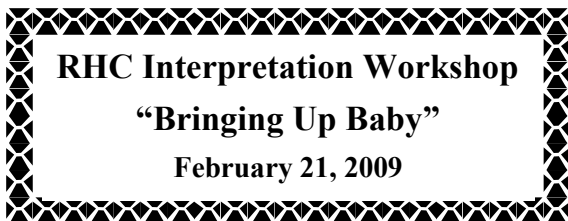

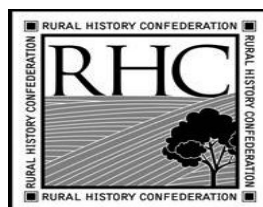
